Meetings

Meetings and programs will be held at Ella Sharp Museum, 3225 S. Fourth St., Jackson, except where otherwise noted. Regular meetings will begin with a social time at 7:00 p.m. with meeting and program to follow. Bring "recyclables" (magazines, books, feeders, etc.) to the programs.

Thursday, September 9--"Conifer Mutations And Horticultural Gems" Hidden Lake Gardens propagation and growing staff Jon Genereaux will introduce you to trees that are seldom seen out of arboretums. Jon will also demonstrate a method of propagation called Grafting, to reproduce a Hidden Lake Gardens treasured secret.

Thursday, October 14--"Jackson Tower Birds" Steve Shotwell who was instrumental in making sure our Jackson Peregrines had a nest to build on and watched over them throughout the nesting season, will give us the complete story of our famous birds.

Thursday, November 11--Annual Meeting and Program: "Exploring The Florida Peninsula" Herons, egrets, eagles and alligators; Oh My! Retired Naturalist Tom Hodgson will show images and tell the stories of some of the most colorful, exciting, and interesting birds, mammals, and reptiles that he has encountered in his travels throughout the sunshine state. He has paddled Florida's rivers, lakes and estuaries with camera in hand, in search of remote rookeries and elusive species. If you're not a "snowbird" now, you may want to be after seeing this program.

Thursday, January 13 --"Of Birds and Berries" Researcher, Julie Craves from the Rouge River

Bird Observatory - UM of Dearborn, will share her knowledge of the fall migrating birds and what fruit they eat to gain fat for their Southerly trip. She will focus on her work with Thrushes (Bluebirds & Robins). This will be a joint program with the Dahlem Center and the program will take place at the DAHLEM CENTER on South Jackson Road.

Friday, February 11--"Backyard Birds And Beyond" Doug Leffler will present a photo program at THE VISTA GRANDE VILLA showing typical backyard birds that we see at home bird feeders, as well as birds seen on area hiking trails. PLEASE BRING A DESSERT TO SHARE.

Thursday, March 10--"East Africa" Chris Vanlonkhuyzen will take us on a visit to the high East African plateau which includes Tanzania and Kenya. These areas have the world's greatest concentration of bird and animal life on our planet. The program will end with a musical synopsis of many of the programs that Chris has done for the Audubon. Also, Chris will present, "Remembering Bob," a tribute to Bob Whiting.

Thursday, April 14--"Simply Dragonflies" Through beautiful photos, Don Henise will teach us the basics of identifying the common dragonflies of Southern Michigan.
